Students will stay in shared rooms with private baths. Wi-fi is available free of charge at the hotels. Students will have access to the hotel pool and should bring their own towels for the beach. Each student will have their own bed (i.e. single bed). Most meals are included in the program, unless specifically indicated on the itinerary (e.g. students are responsible for meals on travel days and several meals at the beach & hot springs). Many of the menus will be set and include 2-3 choices and a drink. Any additional food will be at the students' own expense. Please note that access to ATM machines is limited. It is advised to take money out of the ATM at the airport before passing through customs. Students are encouraged to bring stickers, balloons and other small items to engage local children. Tips for bus drivers, interpreters and other guides are included in the program fee. Students should not tip on their own. Finally please note that this agenda may change depending on the weather or last minute opportunities that come our way.

Packing notes: It is very important to dress appropriately. Only pack modest clothing. Pack bathing suit, insect repellent, sunscreen, and first aid kit.

This clinic is run by Clínica Biblica, a private healthcare provider. Students will visit a private clinic run by the same provider on January 12th and discuss the differences of national vs. private healthcare in Costa Rica. Adelphi students talk with children about exercise and its impact on the health of self, family and society. Use play and activity such as dance, as a mechanism to spread the message of exercise and health. The morning will conclude with a dance party.
